

## **Appendix E**

### **Four Year Start-up**

The four year start up program has not yet been fully developed. However, the general plan breaks the twelve school years into three groups: K-4, 5-8, and 9-12. At the beginning of the fifth year, all the students will utilize the 12 year schedule in Appendix C. Students in the upper grades will be appraised of what we are doing.

#### Grades 9-12

In year one of four we have one year to teach the seniors, two years to teach the juniors, etc. We must then determine what we consider the most important to teach these students in the time available before they graduate

#### Grades K-4

Kindergarten and first grade will essentially remain unchanged from Appendix C. Second grade will incorporate the concepts taught in kindergarten. Grades three and four will of necessity have some catch up, but within two years the students who start out in these two grades should be caught up enough to use the twelve year plan in Appendix C.

#### Grades 5-8

These four grades present the greatest challenge, particularly the eighth grade. We might consider a special twelfth grade schedule for these students in the fifth year. Students beginning in grades 5-7 should have sufficient background in four years to utilize the standard schedule from Appendix C in the fifth year.
